Learning to read

Your child will learn to read in a very simple way. He or she will learn to:

- 1. Read letters by their 'sounds'
- 2. Blend these sounds into words
- 3. Read the words in a sentence.



Read Write Inc.

Children have daily phonics sessions following the Read Write Inc. scheme.

Your child will be put into a small group based on their phonetic knowledge.

They will be taught a new sound everyday and will then 'sound out' and 'blend' words containing this sound.







- In Read Write Inc. the individual sounds are called 'speed sounds' because we want your child to read them effortlessly.
- First your child be be taught sounds made by 1 letter. They will be taught to say the sound for the letter.


e.g 'mmm' as in 'mat', not the the letter name 'em'.





It is important to note that we say 'mmmm' not 'muh' and 'IIII' not 'luh' when teaching the sounds. This really helps the children when they learn to blend sounds together to read words.










Then they will begin to read sounds written with two letters (digraph) and three letters (trigraph).


Your child will know these as 'special friends'.

Each sound has a picture and phrase to help your child remember the sound. They will also learn an action to match the phrase.












For example:


- The sound 'ay' has the phrase 'May I play?' with a picture of children playing together
- The sound 'ee' has the phrase 'What can you see?' with a picture of two boys in a tree.



<u>Split digraphs</u>

Moving on from this your child will learn 'split digraphs'.







Blending

 Once your child knows a sound, they can then begin to read it in a word.


• Children are encouraged to 'sound out' the word first, breaking it down into individual sounds and then 'blend' it together. This is where the children push the sounds together to hear the word.





- Green words are words which your child can 'go ahead' and read as they are made up of the speed sounds that he/she will have learnt.
- The children are encouraged to sound out words they do not know using their 'special friends' and 'sound buttons' to help them.

<u>Alien words</u>



- These are nonsense (pseudo) words.
- These words use the sounds the children learn in Read Write Inc. and so the children must sound out and blend them.
- These words are part of the Read Write Inc. lessons and the Year 1 Phonics Screening Test.


<u>Alien Words</u>



The end of Year 1

• All children in Year 1 will sit a National Phonics Screening Assessment.

- They will read 40 words 20 real and 20 pseudo.
- Everything we do in Read Write Inc. prepares the children for the screening.

The more you love the story, the more your child will love reading!






<u>Helping your child to read</u>

When your child gets stuck on a word, there are a few ways to help:

- Phonics first look for special friends and sound out the word
- Split longer words up (chunking)
- Look for words inside words
- Read on and go back What would make sense? (context)














Read Write Inc. Phonics – information for parents
