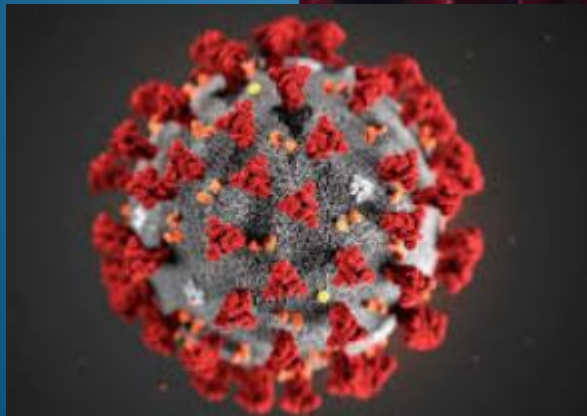

Stepped Sanctions - in private

**Numerous drive bys to have
taken place before stepped
sanctions**

- 1. Reminder of rule**
- 2. Warning**
- 3. Last chance**
(using microscript)
- 4. Time out**
- 5. Restorative conversation**

Microscript

I've noticed that..... You know the school rules ready, respect, safe. Can you remember when I phoned home when you..... and how that made you feel? I expect you to..... Thank you for listening.

Restorative Questions

1. What has happened?
2. What were you thinking at the time?
3. Who has been affected by the actions?
4. How have they been affected?
5. What needs to be done to make things right?
6. How can we do things differently in the future?
