Weekly update from Mr Anderson

Dear families,

I am sure you are all enjoying the good weather that we have currently been blessed with which has been fantastic for everyone at school. This has enabled us all to benefit from the wonderful grounds that we have here. The children and staff have enjoyed utilising our grounds for exercise, breaks and learning.

Next week, our Year 4 children will have a visit from Christine Ball from our Parish (St Agnes) and this will be the start of their preparation for receiving the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation this summer. They will have two/three one hour sessions in preparation for this. We wish them all well in their preparation.

This week in school, our children have been working hard in their assessments and Friday (today) was filled with a mixture of exercise (national daily mile day) and celebration. A big thank you to our Parent Teacher Association for organising the collection for the foodbank today and thank you to our families for their generosity.

Over the next few weeks in school we will be aiming to ease restrictions following the roadmap outlined by The Government. We are aiming to mix in our Key Stages the week beginning 17th May (outside). This would mean our Lower Key Stage 2, Upper Key Stage 2, Key Stage 1 and EYFS being able to mix outside. This is in line with Step 3 of The Government's roadmap. After that, we are hoping restrictions will continue to ease with some sense of normality from the 21st June. Please stay in touch with our weekly updates and over the next few weeks we will be looking at our school timings for drop off and collection. There will be small tweaks soon to continue to ease congestion outside school.

Please remember while on our school premises (adults) to wear a face covering and if your child is coming to school on a bike or scooter make sure they dismount at the gate. We have been so proud of our younger children who were asked to be extremely sensible while leaving school and they have listened so well to this and refrained from playing on the bank by the Year 4/3 and Y3 classroom—let's keep this up. Please also remember to park sensibly outside school and if you can I would encourage you to walk to school. Many thanks as always with your support with this.

Let's hope the lovely weather continues over the weekend and into next week and we all remember it is a shorter week with school closed for the Bank Holiday on Monday and our inset day on Thursday 6th May.
