We did notice extra accessories to our school uniform towards the end of the year so please ensure your child is wearing the correct school uniform from September. We will send more reminders out as we move towards September. A big thank you again to everyone for all the gifts, cards and kind messages received over the last few days.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

To instil a sense of pride and unity at St. Anne's Catholic Primary School the following school uniform is worn:

FOUNDATION STAGE BOYS AND GIRLS (ALL YEAR ROUND):

Red round necked sweatshirt with school badge, Red polo shirt with school badge, Red school cap with school badge, Red Book Bag with school badge, Red drawstring bag with school badge, Black jogging bottoms / leggings / shorts, Black or white socks, Plain black school shoes / trainers (Velcro fastening), Red fleece with school badge, Red coat with school badge

All children should have a spare set of clothes (including underwear and socks) in school in their drawstring bag.

All children need Wellington boots for outdoor play – to be left in school

It is recommended that all children have a warm hat and waterproof gloves/mittens for outdoor play in the winter.

Please note that Foundation Stage children **do not** have a separate summer uniform

KEY STAGES 1 and 2 (Years 1 to 6):

WINTER

Children should wear winter uniform of grey shorts / long grey trousers / grey skirt or pinafore (knee length) or culottes, white shirt / blouse, red jumper / cardigan / fleece, red and grey striped tie, grey socks / tights, black shoes, red coat with school badge

SUMMER

Grey shorts & white polo shirt or red / white checked dress (knee length), red jumper / cardigan / fleece, Grey socks with grey shorts / White socks with checked dress, Black shoes, Red coat with school badge.

If not purchased directly from school, coats MUST be plain RED with no fashion/sports/designer logos.

Book bags, PE bags, ties, sweatshirts and polo shirts (foundation stage only), and school caps are available for purchase from Marks & Spencer website or Lisa's Schoolwear, 275 East Prescott Road, L14 2DB, (tel no: 0151 259 8277)

School coats, waterproof jackets and fleeces are available to purchase from the school office.

P.E. KIT

Indoor - pumps, black shorts, white t-shirt / white polo shirt.

Outdoor - long sleeved red sweatshirt, white t-shirt / white polo shirt, plain black tracksuit bottoms, training shoes.

P.E. kits should remain in school for the whole half term. If children do not remember to bring their P.E. kit to school we have spare kits which they can use; we endeavour to ensure that no child will miss out on P.E. lessons.

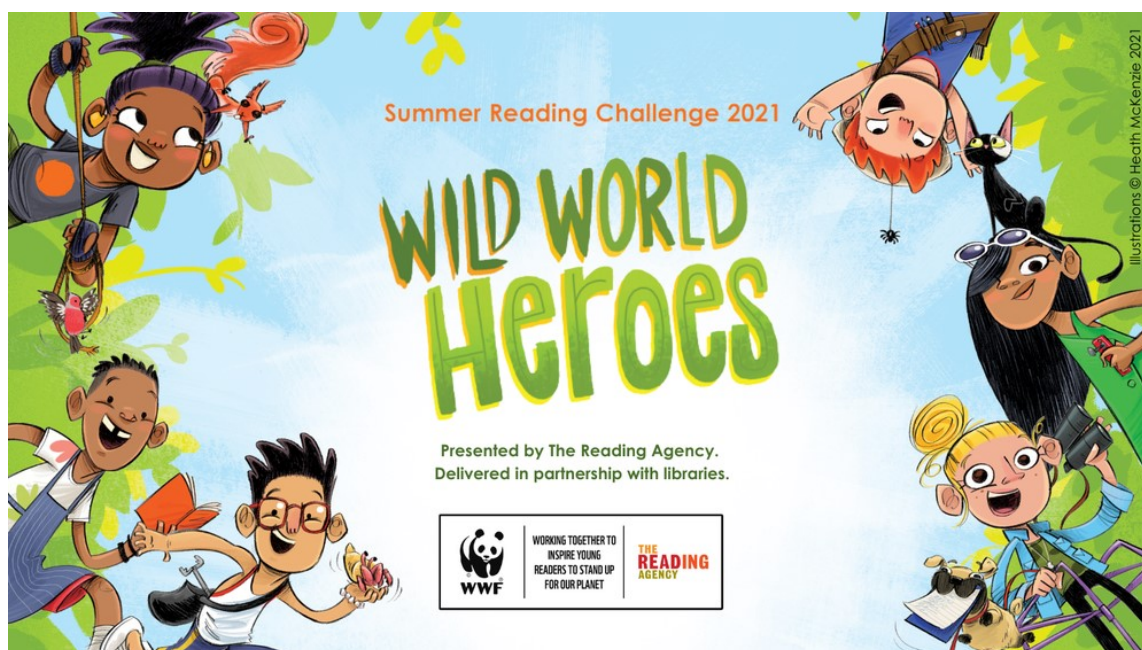

Nursery	<p>Recognise the initial letter from your name or recognise your name.</p> <p>Complete the Speech and Language tasks to support listening skills - set up on seesaw.</p>
Reception	<p>Complete the Speech and Language tasks to support your listening skills.</p> <p>Recognise your own name</p>
Year 1 New Year 1 Children	<p>Read as much as you can! This could be books or words in the environment e.g. signs, posters, shopping lists etc.</p> <p>Can you dress yourself, including zips and buttons?</p>
Year 2 New to Y2 and Y2/1	<p>Can you read facts about Dragonflies (Spain) or Ladybirds (France)? Use your reading and research skills to find out what makes them special. You could even borrow a book from the library.</p> <p>Can you fasten your own shoelaces?</p>
Year 3 New to Year 3 and Y3/4	<p>Can you learn your 2, 5, 10 and 3 times tables?</p> <p>Can you read about Brazil (our class country) you could use the books from a library or the Internet?</p>
Year 4 New to Year 4	<p>Learn as many of your times tables up to 12x12</p> <p>Read as many books as you can - keep a list. Reading Plus can help too.</p>
Year 5 New to Year 5	<p>Can you learn the division facts for your times tables up to 12 x 12?</p> <p>Can you read one news article every week?</p>
Year 6 New to Year 6	<p>Can you learn the first five prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers?</p> <p>Can you read two news articles every week?</p>
