Weekly Update

Dear families,

It is hard to believe we are already half way through November and we will be beginning the season of Advent soon in preparation for Christmas. This time of the year is so exciting for our whole school community and it is wonderful to be part of.

You will know that the ongoing roof repairs are still taking place and I would like to thank you all for your patience with this. We are hoping that it will be finished before Christmas. Let's pray that we all have a wonderful build up to Christmas and our children are able to be INSPIRED in school and find out the real meaning of Christmas.

COVID-19

Please remember COVID-19 is still quite prominent locally and indeed nationally. Take care and if you do have any of the three main symptoms (continuous cough, loss of taste/smell, high temperature) book a PCR test. Over the last two weeks we feel that utilising the different exits around the school (Blacklow exit, Marina Crescent) has helped ease the amount of people leaving from the same exit. Having a significant amount of extra-curricular sessions has helped with this too.

English and Mathematics

If you remember before the National Lockdown in March 2020 we had started our parent/carer family workshops for English. This involved parents/carers of one of our classes coming into school and working with their child in an English session. This was a chance to understand the Literacy Counts scheme that we use in school and to see it in action. We combined this with a physical session with Michael Corless (one of our local soccer coaches) to provide a brain break for everyone. The aim was to show you what is taught in school and to assist you with your child's learning. We are hoping to run one of these sessions before Christmas with Y6/5 and if this proves to be successful possibly continue with other classes after Christmas. This will all be planned around the latest Covid-19 guidance. In the new year we will be aiming to explain more about our mathematics curriculum and the White Rose scheme that we use. In the meantime please check out the English and Mathematics sections on our website, especially for our calculation policy.

Attendance

Attendance at school is mandatory for all pupils and it is so important for children to be in school learning and interacting regularly. It is vital that children are punctual too. Our playground gates will close at 8:50am daily, so children can arrive any time from 8:40am – 8:50am. Good attendance will be celebrated with the best attending class up to half term receiving a half term treat of coming into school in their own clothes and a 'chilled' afternoon. We are currently awarding 100% days by rewarding each class with 50p on a 100% day. This will be counted up to the half term and each class will decide how they spend their money.

Fluenz Nasal Spray




Arrivals in the morning and School Gates


