Classes for next academic year 2023/2024

As we move into July we get a lot of questions about classes and which class children will be in. Most of our families are aware that we have mixed age classes Y1/2 (Dragonflies), Y3/4 and Y5/6 in school, we would like to assure you that the children in each class are taught the same curriculum. Over the last couple of years our staff have worked extremely closely during their Planning Preparation and Assessment (PPA) time to work together to ensure consistency. Children perform equally well in mixed classes.

Children's University



Children's University is a charity that works in partnership with schools to develop a love of learning in children. They encourage and celebrate participation in extra-curricular activities in and outside of school. The impact of the children being involved in extra-curricular activities is proven to be positive which is why Children's University is committed to creating a field of opportunities and opening up access to children of all backgrounds.

If your child attends a club inside or outside of school this is a way to accumulate credits to earn Children's University awards. Any clubs that children attend outside of school must be affiliated with Children's University. This can be done on their website for any clubs wanting to get involved. We have Children's University passports available for sale at the school office to help you keep track of hours attended. During the next academic year, Miss Fraser will inform parents of days she will be collecting credits to ensure all children's credits are collected throughout the year. If you have any questions regarding Children's University please speak to Miss Fraser.

Industrial Strike Action

You will be aware from media coverage that the NEU (Teaching Union) have declared strike action, I am sorry to inform you that our school will be closed on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July. We are asking you do not send your child/children into school on these days.

We have not taken this decision lightly but have reviewed our staffing levels on these dates and we have taken the decision to close the school. We remain committed to providing a safe and secure environment for our pupils and feel that we would be unable to provide safe supervision with the staff we have available.

We are working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation and I will inform you as soon as possible if arrangements change.

If your child is in Year 6 and you have not already done so you should contact your child's secondary school regarding transition day arrangements as this was originally scheduled for Wednesday 5th July.

Our school will reopen as normal on Thursday 6th July and Monday 10th July 2023

Letters will go home shortly about a low-key costume for your child to wear.



School Nursing

What are School Nurses?

- Specially trained nurses
- We work with school aged children from reception until their 19th birthday and up to the age of 25 for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND)
- Every school has a school nurse who is based in a clinic near your school

Who are we?

- Part of a team who support the health and wellbeing of every child aged
- We work within a multi skilled team so the most appropriate person can deal with your needs.

Public Health role

We can provide support for:

- Resilience and wellbeing
- Healthy lifestyles
- Keeping safe
- Maximising learning and achievement
- Supporting complex and additional health and wellbeing needs
- Transition through services



School Nurses work within the 0 - 25 Health and Wellbeing Service in Knowsley to deliver the National Healthy Child Programme and offer a universal service to all.
