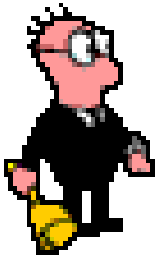

Welcome

- Happy but organised environment
- Behaviour, Attitude and uniform
- Be Ready, Be Respectful, Be Safe (school behaviour policy)
- English, Maths, Science, Research topic and RE Seesaw – communication, all messages should go via the school office.
- Mixed aged classes
- All individual children's needs are met at a level suitable for them.



Daily Routine

- On entering the classroom children complete a Maths/Spelling/Handwriting activity.
- Morning consists of English and Maths.
- Morning play on playground for Bumblebees, Dragonflies, Ladybirds

Milk/Fruit

Lunch in the hall and then children move onto the playground

- Read Write Inc, takes place in the afternoon - children are grouped according to phonetic understanding.
- Steps to Read and foundation subjects after RWI.

Year 1-National Phonics Screening Check...

- Will take place in June
- Children will read 40 words, real and pseudo (referred to as alien words)
- Checks children's ability to blend and decode at a level relevant for their age.
- Relaxed and familiar environment
- Pass mark 32/40...
- If children do not pass they will receive more support and will resit in Year 2.
- Important to practise sounds at home with children.

Reading-Mrs Reale-Smith

- Literacy Counts and Steps to Read
- As part of English lessons children read each day as a class, group or individually.
- Class reading novel
- Whole Class Shared Reading- Steps to Read
- Individual reading – scheme/library book
- Reading Plus/Reading Passports – Please complete additional readings at home



Reading Passports

- For each book your child reads (school book, comic at home, library book etc) your child will receive a stamp in the passport. For a certain amount of books read, they will achieve an award.
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- 40 books = Bronze award.
- 60 books = Silver award
- 100 books = Gold award
- 150 books = Platinum
- (It sounds a lot but most children achieved at least 1 award last year – some managed all 4!)

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For each award your child receives, they will enter the 'Reading Hall of Fame'

Writing- Mrs Reale-Smith

- Writing in English every day but also across the curriculum.
- Joined handwriting is a non-negotiable to be working at Expected level.
- Slow-Writing
- Spelling and Grammar expectations for Y5 and Y6, also need to consolidate LKS2.
- Working on common exception for Y3 and 4, Y5 and 6.
- Exemplification materials- EXP and GDS for Year 6
- Giving children opportunities to work at home.

Spelling-Mrs Reale-Smith

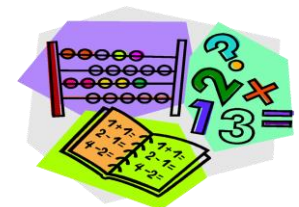
- To be working at Expected level children must apply spelling rules from previous year groups in all writing and spell most of their year groups spellings by the end of the year.
- Daily spellings and teaching in class along with weekly spellings for test on Friday.
- This is a real way you can help us- can be a real barrier to children achieving EXP standard.

Mathematics – Mrs Bannister

- We use the White Rose Scheme
- Daily lessons to develop fluency, problem solving and reasoning.
- Mathletics
- Booster resources online to support topic areas (SATs style questions)
- Basic skills Y4 (Times tables to 12)

Maths – KS1 Miss Frodsham

- At home try to develop your child's mathematical skills through practical activities.
- Games such as snakes and ladders, pairs, dominoes, skittles etc. aid mathematical understanding.
- Familiarise children with a 100 square - adding and subtracting/patterns
- Number bonds and times tables badges
- Recognising coins and making amounts
- Identifying shapes etc.

- Curriculum outline (on website) details topics/subjects to be covered, together with planned visits/visitors.

Homework

Homework is just one of the ways in which you can help your child to develop confidence, It might help to remember:-

- Homework should be enjoyable rather than a chore;
- It will usually relate to something from class or else be a preparation for a future lesson;
- UKS 2: Homework is set on a Friday for both English and Maths – to be returned the following Wednesday- CGP books with dates set.
- Spellings need practice. Children will have lists on Seesaw.
- Reading Plus, Spelling Shed, Mathletics and Times Tables Rockstars support the work in school. Children have been given their passwords.

Year 4 Statutory Times Tables Test

- All year 4 pupils will be sitting a statutory times tables test at the end of the academic year
- Children should learn times tables facts up to 12x12
- We will work on this in class each day.
- TT Rock stars is a great app to support this learning
- Mathletics and Hit the Button also support the speed required.

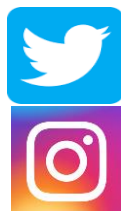
