#### <u>Year 5 Cohort – Bikeability</u>

The children will be allocated a particular date by the class teacher and MUST bring to school their bikes and helmets. This course is designed to give the children confidence and the skills they require to ride their bikes on the roads today.

#### EYFS Phonics Workshop

On Thursday the 21st March we are holding an Early Years Foundation Stage workshop based around Phonics. We will look to offer strategies to help you support your child as they develop their phonic skills with a greater focus on sentence writing. This will be 4:15pm - 5pm and will be based in the school hall.

#### Breakfast Club and Wrap Around Club

As a school we are looking to reduce balances owed for Breakfast Club and Wrap Around Club. We need to ensure outstanding debt is reduced for it to be more manageable for people. As a responsible provider we have taken the decision that if balances for Wrap Around Club are over £50 in arrears and balances for Breakfast Club are over £12.50 in arrears, we will be taking away the facility to book spaces for these on the app. This has been in operation since Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> February.

Balances will be reviewed weekly on a Tuesday. If you are over the threshold on this day the facility will be removed until full balance has been paid. If you make payment in between and believe that the facility to book places should be reinstated, you can contact the school office and we will accommodate.

#### Parental Feedback

We had our annual parental survey last year and we have analysed the results and over the next few weeks we will feedback on these after considering points raise throughout the year.

My child said that she would like to go to after school clubs but not sports—the school does promote other clubs instead of sports like: Good Grub Club, Spanish, Art, drama, music, eco club.

Offer a wider variety of afterschool clubs for the whole academic year—we feel that what we offer extends throughout the year—unfortunately we rely on the school hall for so many of our activities but as a school what we provide is a generous offer.

#### <u>Safeguarding - Gates</u>

Please when arriving on site throughout the school day (not drop off and collection times) please close the school gates behind you. This is to ensure that our site is safe and we know who has entered onto our site. Many thanks for your cooperation with this.

#### Dogs on the School premises

Dogs are only allowed on school premises for educational purposes or with pupils, staff or members of the public as a registered service dog.

The following advice is given out to parents who bring their dogs to school at drop off and pick up times

Dogs are an important part of family life for many in the school community, and as such are often included in day-to-day activities such as walking children to and from school. However, others may find the presence of dogs in the playground and school grounds stressful, even frightening particularly with younger children, and even well-behaved dogs can behave unpredictably when placed in a busy, noisy and crowded environment.

Consequently, dogs are not permitted to access school grounds. The school's priority is the safeguarding of its children and staff.

# <u>Voting</u>

### Elections will be taking place in Knowsley on Thursday 2 May 2024.

This includes local elections as well as the election of the Combined Authority Mayor and the Merseyside Police and Crime Commissioner.

To vote in these elections, you must be registered to vote by 11.59pm on Tuesday 16 April 2024. If you've never registered, have moved address or changed your name, register to vote online at <u>www.gov.uk/register-to-vote</u>

Once you are registered, there are a number of different ways you can vote:-

<u>Postal vote:</u> If you are not already registered for a postal vote, you need to do so by 5pm on Wednesday 17 April 2024

You can apply online for a postal vote by visiting the Government's website. You will be asked to provide your National Insurance Number.

If you are already registered for a postal vote, you don't need to do anything. You will be contacted by the Election Team when your postal vote is due for renewal.

<u>Voting by Proxy</u>: If you are unable to vote in person and would like someone to vote on your behalf, you can apply for a proxy vote. The deadline for applications is 5pm on Wednesday 17 April.

You can request a proxy vote application by contacting Knowsley's Elections Team on 0151 443 2222 or by emailing <u>elections@knowsley.gov.uk</u>

<u>Voting in person at a Polling Station:</u> If you are voting in person on Thursday 2 May, please remember to bring a valid photo ID with you. If you don't have a valid ID, you can apply for a Voter Authority Certificate up until 5pm on Wednesday 24 April. Apply online on the Government's website.

If you are unable to register to vote online, or need assistance in registering for a postal vote, proxy vote or Voter Authority Certificate please contact Knowsley's Elections team on 0151 443 2222 or by emailing <u>elections@knowsley.gov.uk</u>

# <u>CAFOD</u>


As our contribution to the Big Lent Walk , our children will be 'Walking the Lenten Path' over the next 40 days.
