

- Reception: God loves each of us in our uniqueness.







### Phonics - Read, Write, Inc.


- Listening is a key skill.
- Usually teach three new sounds a week.
- Focus on the sound that a letter/digraph makes (not letter names)
- Main principle is <u>reading</u> by segmenting words and blending the sounds to make a word. Support children to hear initial, middle and end sounds.
- Then segmenting words orally to write simple words using the sounds we know.
- Precursive handwriting Correct formation from the outset
  - Hold a sentence/caption to write.
  - Introduces 'red' words













#### Homework

Lots of daily rehearsal with reading/letter sounds will help your child to retain information better.

 New sounds shared daily on Seesaw. Important to recap the sounds they have already covered. Support your child when needed but encourage them to blend and listen carefully for the sounds they say to make a word, independently, as much as possible.


 Phonic games homework this term-lots of opportunities to practise blending and hearing the words that they come across. Remember to model any new words in a full sentence for your child.


Reading books will go home from Spring term

## Writing

Encourage your child to...

- hold a pencil correctly (tripod grasp)
- · Check how your child is currently holding a pencil.






# Writing

Encourage your child to ...

use the correct letter formation as taught in Read, Write Inc. (precursive i.e. start with 'whoosh!'). Handouts provided.








# Reading & Writing

Encourage your child to...

- remember initial capital letter for their names
- sound out words (segment) carefully, listen for all of the sounds. (b-r-e-d or p-r-k)
- Blend sounds together to make words e.g. c-a-t cat.











### Supporting your child at Home

- Ask your child about their day, encourage them to speak in full sentences.
- Daily Seesaw activities
- Play phonic homework games a few times throughout the week.
- · Regularly recap all sounds covered.
- Sing songs and number and nursey rhymes
- Encourage your child to both read and then write their own name. What sounds do they recognize in their name?
- Practise correct letter formation.

With your support, your child will get the most out of the Reception year and help prepare them for Year 1.
