Updated Policies

Attendance - Our Policy

At St Anne's, excellent attendance and punctuality are essential for your child's learning and development. We expect all pupils to attend school every day and arrive on time by 8:50am.

Please notify us by 9.00am if your child is absent and avoid taking holidays during term time, as these are not authorised. We closely monitor attendance, provide support for any difficulties, and take formal action if attendance falls below a certain percentage. Together, we aim to ensure every child benefits fully from their education and grows in a positive, nurturing environment. Being in school is essential to build firm foundations in our children for their futures.

Behaviour - Our Policy

You may have noted that we have tweaked our behaviour policy recently:

At St Anne's Catholic Primary School, we are committed to creating a warm, safe, and respectful environment where every pupil can thrive. Our behaviour policy is built around three simple rules: Be Ready, Be Respectful, and Be Safe. We focus on positive reinforcement through rewards like STAR tokens and Recognition Rainbows to celebrate good behaviour, while also providing supportive steps to help pupils make positive choices when challenges arise. We work closely with our parents/carers to ensure consistent expectations and timely communication, always aiming to nurture happy, confident, and respectful children. Our approach includes restorative conversations and tailored support for pupils with additional needs, ensuring fairness and understanding throughout.

Booking After School Clubs

Early Bird Breakfast Club

We are offering an Early Bird Breakfast Club 7.30am—8.40am, initially this will be for 15 places.

The Early Bird Breakfast Club MUST be booked on the app a minimum 72 hours in advance for staffing purposes and will be at a charge of £5.00 per child and £4.00 per sibling, per session.

Please ensure that you choose EARLY BIRD BREAFAST CLUB for this facility on the app.

An example of booking would be: Book Thursday evening for a place on Monday morning at 7.30am.

If you have not booked you will be refused entry due to Health & Safety procedures. The Early Bird Breakfast Club doors will open at 7:30am to 7:35am, should you arrive after this time, please come to the office and your child will be taken through the building to access the facility.

Late collection Fees for Wrap Around Club

St Anne's Catholic Primary School will charge for the late collection of a child, this will be charged at £2.50 for every 5 minutes late (WAC finishes at 5:30pm).

Breakfast Club and Wraparound Club

Please be aware if you book Breakfast Club and Wraparound Club and your child does NOT attend you will still be charged—so please cancel to avoid this charge via the app or by calling the office.

- If your child's date of birth falls on or between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, now is
 the time to apply for a reception class place in school for September 2026.
- There is no automatic transfer from nursery everyone must apply between 12 September 2025 and 15 January 2026 by completing the application form of the Local Authority in which you live.
- Knowsley residents should apply by accessing the online application portal via the Knowsley website www.knowsley.gov.uk.
- It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to ensure they have read the admission policy of
 each school they are considering applying for and provided all the information required to
 support their application this may include completing a supplementary information form
 with some individual schools where requested.
