What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.

In St Anne's Catholic Primary School we recognise children develop quickly in the early years and aim to give them the best possible start. **The experiences and abilities a child develops up to the age of 5, has a major impact on the child's future life success.** At St Anne's our aim is to ensure that our children learn independence and develop a broad range of knowledge and skills that provide the right foundation for a good future and enable them to make continued progress throughout school and in life.

Areas of Learning and Development

Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through **7 areas of learning and development**.

The three **prime areas** are particularly important for developing communication skills, forming relationships and igniting a curiosity and enthusiasm for learning.

Prime Areas

- Communication & Language
- Personal, Social & Emotional Development
- Physical Development

Specific Areas

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Arts and Design

The four **specific areas** help develop skills and knowledge needed to ensure 'school readiness' in preparation for **Year 1**.

Communication and Language

The development of a child's spoken language underpins all seven areas of learning and development and is a key focus in our language rich Early Years setting.


Archdiocesan Levy

Seesaw is an online digital portfolio that we use to record and document your child's development and progress. We set tasks and post weekly homework activities on here. Please 'like' and make comments on posts.

We would encourage you to post any photos and videos of your child learning away from school too which can be saved in their journal.

You can also access Family and School Announcements or inbox non-urgent messages to your child's teacher via the messages tab.

Please download the app and scan in your family and your child's QR code before your child starts school as we will use this to keep in touch with you and your child over the summer.

Healthy School

One of the prime areas of learning for children in Early Years includes making healthy choices about food and drink and we will be working hard to help them recognise and (hopefully) choose healthier food options. We encourage all children to try new foods including through our school lunches.

Snack examples- apples, bananas, pears, bell peppers, berries and yogurt, crackers and cheese, rice cakes and humus, tortilla chips and salsa dip, ham wrap and salad vegetables or cereal with milk.

We offer our children a wide variety of fruit and vegetables daily and milk or water is always available. We also encourage the children to sip water regularly throughout the day.

We wish to limit the amount of sugar that children have access to in school and would encourage children eating a packed lunch to have just **one** small sugary treat per day.

With this in mind **unfortunately, we do not accept cakes or sweets for birthday treats.**

Stay and Play

We will be holding **two** Stay and Play sessions for your child. We have grouped children to attend as group, 1, 2 or 3.

The first session will be a stay and play with parents or family member. This is an opportunity for your child to come and explore the setting and become familiar with our staff.

The second, a shorter visit, will be an opportunity to drop your child off for approximately half an hour whilst parents/carers retreat to the school hall for a cup of tea.

Induction Timetable

The first weeks of school for your child will be a staggered induction.

Week one School opens Tuesday 2nd September -your child starts their school journey by attending partial days (**morning sessions-New to St Anne's or afternoon sessions - from St Anne's nursery**).

Week two W.B 8th September – Monday, Tuesday & Wednesday your child will attend mornings and stay for lunch, pick up 1pm. Thursday & Friday your child will attend school full days. School gates open at 8:40am and close at 8:50am each morning. School ends at 3:10pm.

Week three W.B. 15th September – Your child will attend full days in line with the rest of the school..

Welcome Pack Return Envelope

Please ensure you return all signed paperwork from your pack, in the envelope provided by 12th June so we can begin to get to know your child.

We will also contact your child's current nursery/childcare provider to arrange a short visit to help us get to know more about your child and about their developmental journey. We will also engage with your child in their familiar nursery setting to support their transition into Reception.

Baseline Assessment

The Department of Education has introduced a **statutory assessment**, for children entering Reception. This is known as the Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA). This is a short, one to one, assessment that will provide a 'snapshot' of what your child can do when they start school. This data will be used at school level to measure the progress of the year group from reception to when they leave us in year 6.

Staff will use the Wellcomm language and communication tool as well as the Trafford Speech and Language Assessment to determine your child's language and understanding ability on entry into Reception. We will set speech and language targets for children during the first half term where applicable.

Early Years staff will complete the RBA and other assessments with your child during their first half term in school.

Starting School what you will need;

Uniform - See uniform list. **Please ensure your child's name is on EVERYTHING! Including shoes and wellies.**

Shoes - please buy 'Velcro' fastening to help develop your child's dressing independence. Laces can be a trip hazard.

Wellies - In Reception we aim to go out every day even when it's wet and muddy.

PE bag - containing spare clothing including underwear and socks.

Download:- Seesaw App, Parent App, ParentPay App.

A water bottle will be provided for your child and they will be encouraged to sip water regularly throughout the day.

Top Tips to prepare your child for Reception

A key aim in Reception is to develop independence, resilience and a motivation to have a go and to keep on trying.

- Encourage your child to be independent e.g. carry their own school bag/lunch box.
- Use the toilet independently and wash and dry their own hands.
- Dress themselves.
- Put on and take off their own coat - practise fastening zips, buttons and poppers.
- Follow and execute simple instructions - get your shoes, close the door, put it on the table.
- Eat with a knife and fork.
- Recognise their own name.
- Write their own name (initial capital letter, then lowercase letters)
- Share with others and take turns
- Discard dummies
