

ATTENDANCE

Dear Parents and Carers,

We would like to remind you that all student absences must be reported to the school on each day of absence. If an absence is not reported, it will be recorded as unauthorised in line with attendance regulations.

We would also like to emphasise the importance of punctuality. Arriving late to school results in the loss of vital learning time, can be disruptive to lessons, and may affect a child's ability to settle into important morning routines. For example, being 10 minutes late every day adds up to almost a full week of learning lost over a school year.

To help illustrate the impact of absences and lateness, please see the table below:

Attendance/Lateness	Approx. Learning Time Lost
10 minutes late every day	1 week per year
20 minutes late every day	2 weeks per year
1 day absent per month	2 weeks per year
2 days absent per month	4 weeks per year
1 day absent per fortnight	2.5 weeks per year

Please note that where a student's overall attendance falls below 90%, absences due to illness may be marked as unauthorised unless appropriate medical evidence is provided.

Examples of acceptable medical evidence may include:

- A doctor's appointment card or letter
- A medical note, prescription, or hospital appointment confirmation

Evidence of attendance at a walk-in centre, GP surgery, or pharmacy consultation

We understand that children may occasionally be unwell, and our aim is to work in partnership with families to support good attendance, punctuality, and consistent routines, which are essential for academic progress and wellbeing. If you have any questions or are experiencing ongoing medical or attendance concerns, please contact the school so we can offer support.

Booking After School Clubs

As usual a message is sent via the app to state that your booking has been confirmed. **This does not mean your child's place will be secured, it will be secured once payment has been received up front, prior to the club starting.** You will then be contacted by the school office to confirm your child's place. Early Bird Breakfast Club

Early Bird Breakfast Club 7.30am–8.40am.

The Early Bird Breakfast Club MUST be booked on the app a minimum 72 hours in advance for staffing purposes and will be at a charge of £5.00 per child and £4.00 per sibling, per session.

Please ensure that you choose **EARLY BIRD BREAKFAST CLUB** for this facility on the app.

An example of booking would be: Book Thursday evening for a place on Monday morning at 7.30am.

If you have not booked you will be refused entry. **The Early Bird Breakfast Club doors will open at 7:30am to 7:35am, should you arrive after this time, please come to the office and your child will be taken through the building to access the facility.**

Late collection Fees for Wrap Around Club

St Anne's Catholic Primary School will charge for the late collection of a child, this will be charged at **£2.50 for every 5 minutes late (WAC finishes at 5:30pm).**

Breakfast Club and Wraparound Club

Please be aware if you book Breakfast Club and Wraparound Club and your child does NOT attend you will still be charged—so please cancel to avoid this charge via the app or by calling the office. We would like to remind parents that should you incur charges over £12.50 for Breakfast Club and £50.00 for Wraparound your account will be locked until the debt has been paid, many thanks for supporting us with this matter.

Nursery Admissions September 2026

For our nursery intake September 2026-2027 it is so important that your child is baptised in the catholic faith and you have evidence of this. The closing date for Nursery admission is 28th February 2026 . When sending your form into school please ensure you receive a receipt for this. Please ensure you have sent in a copy of the baptismal certificate with your application before the closing date above.



February's Musician of the Month

Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan



About: Nusrat Fateh Ali Khan (1948 – 1997) was a Pakistani singer, songwriter, and music director. He was primarily a singer of qawwali — a form of Sufi devotional music and is considered by The New York Times to be the greatest qawwali singer of his generation. He was known for his vocal abilities and could perform at a high level of intensity for several hours. Khan is widely credited with introducing qawwali music to international audiences. He was also a master in Hindustani classical music.
